LMS Integration

Implementation completed for Canvas, Blackboard, Brightspace, and Moodle

Single textbooks can now be integrated, with full instructions available on the website. If the institution has already subscribed for the student, the student will be taken directly into Cambridge Spiral via the integration link. If the student is required to pay for access or enter an access code on first entry, they will be shown those screens. Once they've processed that point of access option, every time afterwards they will enter the eReader automatically using that deep link.

Digital Examination Copies

Exam copies now delivered by Cambridge Spiral

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The order process remains the same, but now instructors will receive access to the textbook via our reading apps or browser rather than via Box.com. This change helps our efforts towards environmental sustainability, as instructors can review content digitally rather than solely through printed copies with their shipping implications, and if the book is published access is almost instantaneous. It also means instructors can review the value of the content as well as the value of the eReader for delivering that content at once.

Changes to eTextbook chapter access

Chapter-level deep links



Instructors can now place chapter-level links in the course notes, syllabus, or an email to students. These links go

straight to the chapters students may be required to read that week, or the chapters may be part of further helpful reading notes. If the institution has already subscribed for the student, the student will be taken directly into Cambridge Spiral. If the student is required to pay for access or enter an access code on first entry, they will be shown those screens. Once they've processed that point of access option, every time afterwards they will enter the eReader automatically using that deep link.

Chapter landing pages

These new landing pages include chapter summaries (either author generated or lifted directly from the opening paragraphs of the chapter) and chapter-level key words. These make chapter-level content more visible and discoverable to instructors as well as students, at a more granular level in our collection.

SeamlessAccess Implementation

One log-in across multiple publisher platforms, now including Higher Education from Cambridge University Press



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SeamlessAccess is a cross-publisher initiative that aims to enable a more streamlined online access experience for users of scholarly resources. The SeamlessAccess button is the new starting point for the institutional login journey for instructors and students accessing textbooks in an array of disciplines. Crucially, SeamlessAccess enables true single sign-on across publisher platforms, and obviates the need for repeated log-in attempts as users move from one provider to another in the course of their research and learning activity. SeamlessAccess is supported by a growing list of Service Providers, including the American Chemical Society (ACS), Elsevier ScienceDirect, Emerald Publishing, IOP Publishing, Nature, Sage Publishing, Taylor & Francis, Wiley Online Library and Wolters Kluwer.
